GENERAL INFORMATION:

The CD-ROM or Downloaded Folder contains PDF copies of most of the Presentations that were given at the March 29, 2008 Family History Conference.

All documents and files are saved in PDF format using Adobe Acrobat 7.0 Professional. To open, read, and print these files, the user can use the free Adobe Reader software already loaded on most computers or which is available as a free download from <http://www.adobe.com/products/acrobat/readstep2.html>

MEDIA:

The Conference files are available on a CD-ROM which was distributed without charge to those attending the March 29th conference. A limited number of additional copies are available from the Family History Center during its normal hours of operation which are Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9am to 8:30pm.
